



Change in Per-Pupil Revenue Over T



Percent change in state formula per student, inflation-adjusted, fiscal years 2008-2016.





States also typically provide revenue for other, more specific purposes, such as bus transportation and contributions to school employee pension plans. California, Hawaii, Indiana, and Kansas are excluded because the data necessary to make a valid companson.

Wisconsin has cut \$3.5 **BILLION** in state aid to public schools since 2011
